Minutes of Meeting Thursday, August 2, 2018

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 368 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 2, 2018, at the District meeting place located inside the District, whereupon the roll was called of the members of the Board to-wit:

All members of the Board were present, thus constituting a quorum. Consultants in attendance were: Mike Plunkett and Erica Martinez of Eagle Water Management, Inc. ("Operator"); Matthew Carpenter, P.E. and Kameron Pugh, E.I.T., of IDS Engineering Group ("IDS" or "Engineer"); Kaye Townley of Municipal Accounts and Consulting, L.P. ("MAC" or "Bookkeeper"); and Martye Kendrick, attorney, and Mirna Croon, paralegal, of Johnson Petrov LLP ("JP" or "Attorney").

The President called the meeting to order at 6:46 p.m. and in accordance with the notice posted pursuant to law, the following business was transacted:

I. **Public Comment.** There was no public comment.

II. General Business.

- District's Website. Director Lackey asked that an update regarding the Northern A. Point drainage project be posted on the website.
- В. Pay Bills and Estimates. There were no pay bills/estimates presented.
- III. Operator's Report. The President recognized Mr. Plunkett who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Operator's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A". Mr. Plunkett noted that the District had 93.5% accountability for the period from June 12, 2018 through July 12, 2018. He also noted that 55.42% of the District's water came from the surface water source with the remainder from the District's groundwater wells.

Mr. Plunkett reported that an orifice plate to control flow between Water Plant ("WP") No. 2 and WP No. 1 has been installed.

Mr. Plunkett reviewed the Collections Agency Report, a copy of which is attached to the Operator's Report. He then reviewed with the Board the Termination List, a copy of which is attached to the Operator's Report, and affirmed that all Customers on the list were at least sixty (60) days past due and had been notified in writing of their right to attend this meeting to address the Board.

Upon motion by Director Cook, seconded by Director Lackey, after full discussion and with all Directors present voting aye, the Board (i) approved the Collections Agency Report; (ii) authorized termination of service to customers listed on the Termination List, in accordance with provisions of the District's Rate Order; and (iii) approved the Operator's Report as presented.

- IV. <u>Engineer's Report</u>. Mr. Carpenter presented to and reviewed with the Board the Engineer's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "B"</u>.
 - A. Northern Point Drainage. Mr. Carpenter reported that the contractor is installing the Stormwater Quality Inlet Structure and piping. During excavation, the contractor encountered groundwater approximately 1-foot above the top of the storm sewer pipe at the point of connection to the inlet structure, requiring groundwater control to complete the work. Mr. Carpenter noted that due to such unforeseen field conditions, the contractor has submitted a proposal to complete the groundwater control work at a cost of \$32,435. Mr. Carpenter stated IDS will solicit additional proposals to ensure the current proposal is competitive. He recommended the Board approve a proposal at a cost not to exceed \$32,435 and appoint a Board member to approve the final proposal.
 - B. <u>Facility Improvement and Maintenance Plan</u>. IDS is coordinating with the Financial Advisor to determine any tax implications of the anticipated bond issue.
 - C. <u>Hufsmith-Kohrville Improvements</u>. There were no new matters to report.
 - D. <u>Operations Committee Meeting</u>. The Operations Committee meeting has been scheduled for August 30, 2018.
 - E. <u>Water Quality Monitoring for Water Wells Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6</u>. Mr. Pugh reported that the July 2018 laboratory test results for benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene, or xylene (BTEX) in Water Wells Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are non-detect.
 - F. Water Plant Nos. 1 and 2. This matter was discussed under the Operator's Report.
 - G. <u>Water Plant ("WP") Ground Storage Tank Rehabilitation</u>. The first ground storage tank is back in service. The contractor is finished with all the coating and is cleaning up the site. IDS will schedule a final walkthrough inspection in the next few weeks.
 - H. <u>TCEQ Compliance</u>. IDS is working on obtaining approval of the sanitary control easements and Water Well No. 6 acceptance.
 - I. <u>Phase 4 Sanitary Sewer Rehab.</u> Mr. Carpenter reported that IDS has prepared plans and specifications for the Phase 4 Sanitary Sewer Control and Televising Inspection. The bids should be presented at the next meeting.

- J. <u>Sandy Stream Sewer Capacity Evaluation: Upsize required for Dungrove tract.</u>
 There were no new matters to report.
- K. <u>Lift Station ("LS") Panel Replacements</u>. There were no new matters to report.
- L. <u>Wastewater Treatment Plant ("WWTP") Rehabilitation</u>. The work is complete. IDS will conduct an inspection of the wet well coatings prior to the end of the one-year warranty to address any potential deficiencies in the coating.
- M. <u>NorthPointe Center Phase 2 (Santikos)</u>. The plans have been approved and the contractor has mobilized.
- N. <u>136-Acre Finger Tract</u>. A developer has contacted IDS with interest in developing the tract. There are no new updates.
- O. <u>9.6-acre Riverside Tract Potential Annexation</u>. The developer is working with the landowner to purchase land for commercial use.
- P. Hufsmith Heights tract. There are no matters to report.

Next, upon motion by Director Cook, seconded by Director Dunn, after full discussion and with all Directors present voting aye, the Board (i) approved a proposal related to the Northern Point drainage project not to exceed \$32,435, and appointed Director Lackey to approve the final proposal; and (ii) approved the Engineer's Report.

V. <u>Developer's Report</u>. There was no report.

VI. Attorney's Report.

- A. Minutes of July 10, 2018 and July 19, 2018. Upon motion by Director Daniel, seconded by Director Cook, after full discussion and with all Directors present voting aye, the Board approved the minutes of the July 19, 2018 Board meeting as amended. The minutes of the July 10, 2018 Board meeting were tabled.
- B. Amend Rate Order. No action was taken.
- VII. <u>Adjournment</u>. With no additional matters before the Board, the Board adjourned the meeting at 7:45 p.m.





The status of the various projects in the District is as follows:

GENERAL DISTRICT MATTERS

1. Northern Point Drainage

The contractor is installing the Stormwater Quality Inlet Structure and piping. During excavation, the contractor encountered groundwater approximately 1-foot above the top of the storm sewer pipe at the point of connection to the inlet structure, requiring groundwater control to complete the work. Once we receive the proposal from the contractor, we will prepare the change order documents.

2. Facility Improvement and Maintenance Plan

We are coordinating with the Financial Advisor to determine the tax implications of the anticipated bond issue. We expect to have more detailed information by the next meeting.

3. Hufsmith Kohrville Improvements

No new activity to report

4. Operations Committee Meeting

The next Operations Committee Meeting has not been scheduled.

5. Water Quality Monitoring for Water Well Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6

6. Water Plant Nos. 1 and 2

An orifice plate to control flow between Water Plant No. 2 and Water Plant No. 1 has been installed.

7. Water Plant Rehabilitation

The first ground storage tank is back in service. The contractor is finished with all the coating and is cleaning up the site. We will schedule a final walkthrough inspection in the next few weeks.

8. <u>TCEQ Compliance</u>

We are working on obtaining approval of the sanitary control easements and Water Well No. 6 acceptance.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM MATTERS

Phase 4 Sanitary Sewer Rehab

We have prepared plans and specifications for the Phase 4 Sanitary Sewer Cleaning and Televising Inspection. We plan to have bids by the next meeting.

10. Sandy Stream Sewer Capacity Evaluation: Upsize Required for Dungrove Tract

No new activity to report.

11. Lift Station Control Panel Replacements

We have received specifications from the manufacturer and are reviewing the information.

12. Wastewater Treatment Plant Rehabilitation

The work is complete. We will conduct an inspection of the wet well coatings prior to the end of the one-year warranty period to address any potential deficiencies in the coating.

RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

13. Harris County Street Acceptance Status

All streets eligible for acceptance have been accepted by the County.
